DOG FIELDS

We have two dog fields (Willow Field and Activity Field) which you are welcome to use. Nick or Steph will tell you which one is in use when you arrive as sometime the sheep are in them. The majority of the time both of the fields will be open (especially in the summer) - there will always be at least one open.

Please do not go in the field where the sheep are. Most of the sheep are scared of dogs. We will tell you which field the sheep are in on your arrival.

No dogs are allowed in the goat and chicken field

General

Please leave the gates as you find them. The majority of the time the gates will be closed.

You are welcome to let your dog off lead **once you are in the Activity Field or Willow Field.**

Please pick up after your dog and place it in the bin provided. The bin is in the recycling area. Help us keep the fields clean and dog poo free for everyone's enjoyment.

Please discourage your dog from making excessive noise whilst on site.

Do not allow your dog to dig holes in the field.

Being agricultural land there is the potential for areas of uneven ground or holes which could be concealed under long grass or other vegetation, and may from time to time have overhanging branches from trees around the edges which may fall or have fallen and could contain other hazards consistent with the countryside and, any as such, any incidence of same which causes or contributes to injury to you, your family, friends or your dog(s); Barons Court Caravan Park cannot be held liable.

The fences and gates are regularly checked. However, as part of your use and enjoyment of the fields you agree to be mindful of any holes or other damage to the fence or gate. Such damage may occur from time to time for various reasons, including digging by dogs or other animals (which may cause an opening or breach in either the gate or fence), falling trees or branches and general wear and tear. If you become aware of, or observe, any issue with the condition of the fence or gate, please make us aware immediately so that we can repair it as soon as possible.

If the field is being used by somebody else, please either wait until they come out or ask if they would mind if you come in. Some dogs are not good with other dogs.

We hope your dog(s) enjoy their break at Barons Court Caravan Park as much as you do and maybe they even have a chance to try something new!

Fields

Willow Field

In the winter 2024/2025, we planted a small willow wood in one of the fields. Some of rods are still very small and the taller ones are not established yet. When walking in the field, please make sure your dog(s) don't pull up the rods or run into them.



Activity Field

The intention for the dog activity field and agility equipment to be enriching and to improve fitness and flexibility, spatial awareness and provide your dogs with an additional fun sensory experience. Please use any equipment you find respectfully and leave it as you found it. The equipment is for dogs only, not adults or children to climb on.

Agility Equipment

Any logs, tyres, jumps, tunnels or other activities in the field are to be used at your own risk. Barons Court Caravan Park is not liable for any death, damage, injury or loss to any person or animal while using the dog walking fields or the equipment within it, or to any third party as a result of any person or dog.

Please do not use equipment in wet or icy conditions as surfaces become slippery.

Dogs should not be picked up and placed on obstacles. When using equipment above ground level it is advisable for dogs to wear a harness so that they can be supported during the exercise especially if they are not use to the equipment.

Never push dogs to do anything that they are not physically or mentally capable of. Allow dogs to go at their own pace and always let them choose whether they want to do it or not. Ensure dogs warm up properly first.

Equipment is checked regularly to ensure its safety. Please ensure you and your dogs are using the field and its contents in a way that is consistent with fitness, age (puppies should not use the jumps due to their developing growth plates) and physical capability to prevent any harm.

If the equipment is not out, please feel free to get it out but remember to put it back afterwards. If the equipment is already out, please leave it out as I maybe using it later on that day.

Rally

Rally involves you and your dog working as a team to navigate a course with numbered signs indicating different exercises to perform. It is a sort of obedience exercise obstacle course including simple exercises.

There are 6 different levels with Level 6 being the most difficult. The signs progressively get more difficult as you move up the levels.

We have a full set of rally signs. If you would like to know more about it or would like to have a go, please ask Steph.
