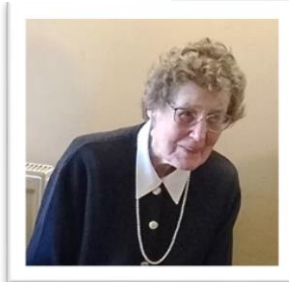




Recent Events

They won the Disabled Driving Class at Royal Windsor – her proudest moment – taking part in displays at Heathfield show, Herstmonceux Castle and South of England at Ardingly. She also drove Prince with Val Eyres at Heathfield and the Oaks show for many years.

Brenda was a very generous person and she and Jerry sponsored all our rosettes for many years. Apart from her driving, she helped run Chiddingly Arts Festival every Autumn.

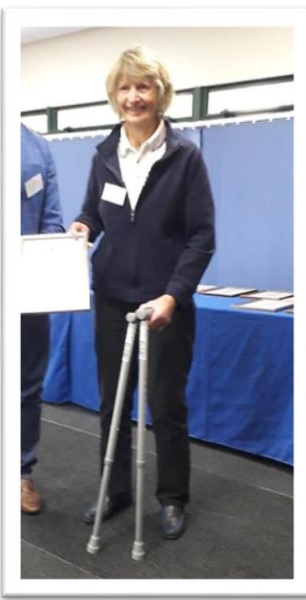
RDA South East Conference 2025
